Global Ministries University is partnering with Globalization for the Common Good Initiative in organizing and planning for an international conference on the Dialogue of Civilizations and Dialogue of World Religions next June 12-16 in Alexandria, Egypt. (www.gcgalexandria2011.info)

Professor Richard Bulliet, Professor of Middle East Studies at Columbia University, will be one of the keynote speakers for the conference. Professor Bulliet is the author of *The Case for an Islamo-Christian Civilization* (Columbia University Press: 2004). The conference host is the Dialogue Forum at the Bibliotheca Alexandrina (Library of Alexandria) in Alexandria, Egypt. GMU is also working closely with the Institute for Peace Studies at the Library of Alexandria in development of a Master's degree program in Peace Studies offered jointly by GMU, the Institute for Peace Studies at the Library of Alexandria and Globalization for the Common Initiative.

GMU will also be a sponsor for a conference preparatory to the international conference in Alexandria at Santa Clara University on February 20, 2011. MEET OUR FACULTY

Rev. George Gonzalez, Ph.D., one of the many competent instructors on the Global Ministries University staff, is proudly featured in this publication.



Rev. Gonzalez teaches two courses for Global Ministries University: Spirituality of the Psalms and Alcohol/Drug Addictions and Spirituality but also wears many other hats. He resides in Westlaco, TX, where he has been a hospital chaplain for seven years and is currently a correctional chaplain for several prisons/jails. He has also been an instructor for several colleges and at the present time he teaches psychology, theology, and music history for both traditional and non-traditional colleges. Additionally, he has a private practice as a board certified clinical psychologist and addictions counselor.

He has several degrees, including a Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology and Addictions and a Doctor of Divinity in Theology. He also holds a Master of Theological Studies, a Master of Arts in Religion, and a Master of Business Administration. In addition to his degrees, he is licensed by the State of Texas as a Chemical Dependency Counselor, a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist, Certified Addiction Specialist, National Certified Psychologist, Certified Pastoral Counselor (Fellow) by the American Association of Pastoral Counselors, and is a Certified Chaplain, certified by the Professional Association of Chaplains.

Rev. Dr. Gonzalez has been a Catholic priest for twenty-three years and was formerly an associate pastor and pastor for several parishes. He is bilingual and fluent in both English and Spanish.

John Jeffery holds a Master of Divinity degree and is currently enrolled in the GMU Doctor of Ministry degree program. He is an ordained interfaith minister, graduate of the Pacific School of Religion/Graduate Theological Union, Clinical Pastoral Education and the Metta Institute, as well as a Board Certified Clinical Chaplain, Certified Thanatologist in death, dying and bereavement by the Association of Death Education and Counseling. He also holds endorsement for specialized ministry with the Federation of Christian Ministries.

John is currently the Director of Spiritual Care Services and Clinical Pastoral Education for the Napa-Solano Area of Kaiser Permanente and oversees the spiritual care program for this 250,000 member region of Kaiser Permanente. He also supervises a staff of chaplains in two medical centers, a hospice and palliative care program.

Additionally he initiated and supervises the first accredited Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) program in Kaiser Permanente. This CPE program, which is accredited by the College of Pastoral Supervision and Psychotherapy, provides clinical training for prospective chaplains, local ministers and other healthcare providers. Graduates of this program are eligible for certification as Board Certified Clinical Chaplains.

He has facilitated growth groups focused on the themes of healing and wholeness for over 25 years. His work has included: pastor of local church congregations, leading wilderness journeys throughout the west and north to the arctic, program consulting for non-profit organizations, and end of life spiritual care. For 15 years, John led popular workshops for caregivers throughout the Bay Area.

After being in ministry for almost 30 years, he felt it was time to do additional study and research. Some of this desire was rooted in his desire to re-stimulate his professional knowledge as well as explore some new area of focus. When asked why he chose Global Ministries University, he stated that *“as an adult learner, it provided me the greatest flexibility to achieve these goals in a manner which fit my professional work schedule and offered a variety of professors and methods of study.
