

Misinformation vs disinformation: what's



the difference, and why does it matter?

In last month's column, I said I would talk next about writing a thesis statement. But because in the United States the presidential election looms closer and closer, and we're all being bombarded with emails, texts, "snail" mail,

TV ads, phone calls, and—most significant of all—social media postings spreading "information" about candidates, measures, or propositions, I think it's more appropriate to explore this topic. As I'm sure everyone understands by now, what you read, hear, or see online or in print may or may not be factual. Thus, we hear the terms "misinformation" and "disinformation," sometimes (wrongly) used interchangeably.

The terms *misinformation* and *disinformation* both refer to false or inaccurate information, but they differ in meaning:

- 1. **Misinformation:** This is false or inaccurate information that is spread without the intention to deceive.
- 2. **Disinformation:** This refers to false information that is deliberately created and spread with the intent to mislead or manipulate. It's intentionally designed to deceive or influence people's opinions, beliefs, or actions. We see much more disinformation during an election cycle.

Examples: Awhile back the local newspaper in our small town in rural, wildfire-prone Northern California published a piece about a guy who one evening, probably after imbibing "tee many martoonis" (as my dad used to say) looked over into the hills behind his house and felt certain they were on fire. He was convinced he saw a glowing, red ball of flames rising in the hills and called the emergency number, 911. After a few more sips of his martini, he looked again and realized—oops, it was the moon coming up over the treetops, the red color reflecting the setting sun. He quickly called 911 again and apologized. He'd given out **misinformation**. Unintentionally.

Now imagine that this fellow's young son, working reluctantly on a challenging homework assignment, looks out the window and sees the same thing. Knowing full well that the red ball is actually the moon, but thinking quickly, he devises a plan: he runs to his dad yelling, "Fire, fire! We have to evacuate!" in an attempt to avoid doing his homework. "Nice try," his dad calmly responds, "Now get back in there and finish your algebra assignment." The boy's false reporting is a case of **disinformation**. It was intentional.

And then there's **fake news**, which has been defined as "purposefully crafted, sensational, emotionally charged, misleading or totally fabricated information that mimics the form of mainstream news" (Zimdars & McLeod, 2020). Had the gentleman or his son in the example above written an article or posted a factual-sounding report on Facebook or somewhere describing a huge, raging fire consuming the foothills and threatening hundreds of


homes, they'd have created fake news.

All three of these forms of false information are dangerous and can affect the outcome of public policy, elections, and academic research. Don't believe everything you read or hear. Analyze, investigate, do further research. Check a variety of reliable sources before accepting questionable information. And don't drink "too many martinis!"


"Belonging Together: Migrants, Refugees, Displaced People and Global Solidarity"



Mark your calendar for World Interfaith Harmony Week, February 6 - 8, 2025. GMU is once again collaborating with Tangaza University, IRDIS, and the Harmony Institute of Kenya on a third international online conference dedicated to fostering the precepts of Pope Francis' encyclical, Fratelli Tutti. Titled, "Belonging Together: Migrants, Refugees, Displaced People, and Global Solidarity," the conference will focus on "the inseparability of the human family—people belong together regardless of their origin and residence status. At the same time, the title alludes to the irrevocable responsibility of humankind for mutual care—being human and being in solidarity with others, especially the most vulnerable, belong together."







Keynote speakers for the conference include Rev. Daniel G. Groody, C.S.C. author of A Theology of Migration: The Bodies of Refugees and the Body of Christ, which won first-place honors from the Catholic Press Association; Cardinal Michael Czerny, S.J., Prefect of the Vatican's

STATEMENT ON THE ABDUCTION OF SEVEN TURKISH ASYLUM SEEKERS IN

While Abdullah Genc, Necdet Seyltoğlu, and Saadet Taşçı have been reportedly released, Oztürk Uzun, Alparslan Taşçı, Mustafa Genc, and Hüseyin Yeşilsu remain missing and are at grave risk of refoulement— a serious violation of international law. Some of these individuals have lived pescolity in Kenya and are known to us, as well as many Kenyans, sa

This incident constitutes a breach of both Kenya and international refugee law. These individuals are refugees who have sought the protection of the Kenyan government. Their abductions underscore the growing concerns about the safety of all refugees and asylum seekers in Kenya.

The Kenyan government must urgently act to locate the missing Turkish asylum seekers, ensure their safety, and prevent their forced return to Turkey, where they are at grave risk of persecution.

IRCK joins hand's with local and international human rights organisations that have spoken and issued statements on this tragic development to call on the United Neepley and the international enternational to the control of the imperior of the imperior of the imperior of the United Neepley concerning that this is happening in the month that Kenyah Sources.

This incident marks a disturbing trend in Kenya. A country once regarded as a safe haven for refugees is now becoming a hostile and dangerous environment for those seeking protection. We appeal to the Government of Kenya to ensure that all asylum seekers and refugees are protected from criminal abduction and unlawful return to countries where their lives and freedoms are in danger. It must uphold its legal obligations under the Kenyan Constitution, refugee laws, and international human rights treatles.
